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Vision/Purpose

Emmaus exists to partner with parents, in providing a Christ-centred, Biblically-grounded and academically-rigorous education, which enables students to grow in wisdom and character, to the glory of God.

Values

1. Caring for Others

At Emmaus, we value, care for and respect each other because we are all made in the image of God. We partner with parents to care for and develop the whole person- body, soul and spirit. We foster a sense of belonging, celebrate one another's achievements and choose to be grateful for our school and each other. We are a community that learns in a fun, creative, encouraging and generous environment.

2. Striving for Mastery

At Emmaus, we encourage students to strive for excellence in all aspects of life: in study, work, and in relationships with God and with people. We believe God equips every person with gifts and abilities. We seek to instil in our students a strong desire to apply their utmost to what they do, an attribute that will long outlive their school years. Students are encouraged to master and apply academic and life skills in order to make the most of their opportunities in later life. Our goal is to equip students with the necessary skills and understanding to make wise and Godly choices, and to live resilient, fulfilled, and productive lives.

3. Equipping for Service

At Emmaus, our motivation for service is the love that Christ has shown us: his life of servant leadership is the example we seek to follow. Staff at Emmaus model integrity, accountability and the value of excellence in our work. We strive to equip students with both the desire and the skills to make a difference in the lives of others. We aim to grow students who are rich in Godly wisdom and noble character, and find their security in the love of Christ.

Purpose

Emmaus was established by a group of parents and continues to encourage parents to be involved with their child's education and school life generally, as this benefits the student as well as the school.

We are a small school and need parents to help us keep the running costs at a reasonable level. This involvement is formalised through our Parent Involvement Program (PIP). PIP is designed to encourage all parents to offer practical assistance to the school in a variety of areas.



The Policy

Preschool PIP Hours

Preschool families (without siblings in Primary or Secondary), are asked to volunteer a total of 10 hours during the year. Parents are welcome to do more hours than this.

Primary and Secondary School PIP Hours

Primary and Secondary School families are asked to volunteer a total of 25 hours during the year (12 hours per parent for separated single parent families), roughly 6 hours per term.

Compulsory Fete Hours

All families (Preschool, Primary & Secondary) are required to perform 2 hours of their annual PIP at the **annual school Fete**.

Student Helpers – Must be approved by Business Manager

In certain situations, students aged 15 years and older may perform PIP hours on the families behalf ONLY if the task has been approved by the Business Manager before hand. Contact the Business Manager to clarify if the proposed help is approved.

Ways to Help

Parents may provide voluntary work at the school in a range of areas that fall into either of 2 categories:

- **1. Non-student related** **or** **2. Student related** (need WWVP)

Recording PIP Hours

PIP hours need to be carried out within the required needs of the school. PIP hours need to be recorded at the front office before the advertised closing date in November each year.

Cost of Unfulfilled PIP Hours

Each time a family volunteer their time, their effort is credited at an hourly rate.

While we would prefer parents to serve their PIP hours, however if a family is unable to serve these hours; a parent may choose to simply pay equivalent monies and not do any practical work at the school. Their money will then be used to pay someone to do work for the school as needed.

Towards the end of November, parents will be invoiced any outstanding PIP hours at \$50 per hour.

PIP – Parent Involvement Program. Thank you in advance for your participation in our PIP program. Parent involvement sends a clear message that our Emmaus Community is worth time, effort and sacrifice.

Note: 2 Hours of PIP per year must now be done at the Twilight Fete to ensure sufficient helpers.

Remember any parents who come to assist in our classrooms and have contact with our students **MUST** have a valid **Working With Vulnerable People (WWVP) card**. Helpers are to work in a class with a child of their own – unless by special arrangement.

Keep your PIP log up to date (this digital register is in the Front Office).

In term 4, should your PIP task fall after the closing date please log these hours in advance in the register.

NO MORE PIP hours can be added after this date.
