Principal Matters

Dear Parents,

It has been quite a couple of weeks, and I am pleased to share with you again today.

As Principal I've accepted the stepping down of our Head of Primary, Caroline Orr. This undoubtedly brings new opportunities to refresh and engage. Caroline will remain a teacher at our school, and we are very excited about that. We will soon start the process of seeking Expressions of Interests and will keep you up to date in this space. I have always valued the harmonious working relationships we enjoy at school and deeply appreciate the passion of Caroline in her position, supported by all our staff and the dedicated leadership team. I thank God for it every day. Caroline will be on Long Service Leave in Term 4. We will, therefore, aim to have a new Head of Primary starting in Term 4 this year.

As Public Advocate for the Australian Association of Christian Schools, I've just been through a roller-coaster of pre-election work, meetings and speaking engagements and now dealing with some post-election follow-up work. One of our longest serving staff members, Mr Godfrey Muthomi, will enter the joy of semi-retirement at the end of this term. At the appropriate time, we will farewell Godfrey, but this is what Godfrey himself recently wrote to staff:

Dear Colleagues,

It's with mixed emotions that I announce to you that my time in Emmaus Christian School as a permanent member of teaching staff will be over by the end of this term. I have thoroughly enjoyed working with you. I have learnt a lot professionally, I have felt included, valued and loved. My modus operandi at Emmaus for the many years has been guided and informed by the following scripture, "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to act" [Proverbs 3:27]. I will miss the fellowship, camaraderie, and friendship, but I will remember you in my prayers. I embrace my new chapter of life with great confidence and trust in our Lord God. "But now, thus says the LORD, who created you, O Jacob, And He who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are Mine. Isaiah 43:1-2]"

As a Christian school, we aim for our students to understand that salvation is only to be found in Jesus. In other words, outside ourselves. Why do we do this? Not just because the gospel (good news) of Jesus Christ is central to what we do, it is also because this is the glorious hope we have in eternity with Christ.

So how did it happen that we can be reconciled to God?

On the cross, Christ paid the debt for every selfish desire, thought, word, or deed to which we will ever give ourselves.

We no longer have to be afraid to own up to our selfishness. We do not have to whitewash our thoughts and motives. We do not have to cover our sin by blaming others or by self-atonement logic. We do not have to give ourselves to acts of penance (self-atonement) that make us feel better about ourselves. We do not have to search for biblical passages that will give ease to our consciences.

No, our debt has been fully paid. Our punishment has been borne by Another. There is One who has taken our place and been condemned instead of us.

The Apostle Paul says, "Having forgiven us all our trespasses, by cancelling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross." (Colossians 2:13b—14).

As God's child, we have been forgiven for every act of self-focused independence and rebellion. We have been freed from the debt of your every failure to love God above all else and your neighbour as ourselves.

We no longer need to live in hiding. Forgiving grace welcomes us out of the darkness to lift the burden of refusal, guilt, fear and shame off our shoulders.

So, we have been invited to confess and receive the forgiveness that is ours and doing so we are perfectly reconciled to God. What a glorious God we have!

From the Board Chair

This week the board facilitated another successful Association AGM, with time to reflect on the successes of the past twelve months, and discuss continued changes to things like our Constitution and legal entity to ensure we remain as healthy and vibrant as possible. Our Treasurer Josh Thow was able to report on a strong balance sheet for the past year, which, alongside Charlotte Kruger's hard work to submit two Block Grant Authority (BGA) applications, puts us in good stead to continue planning the capital works as laid out in our building master plan. We are also delighted that the AGM voted in two new board members in Susie Edwards and Laura Day. Both bring an exceptional diversity of experience and ability to the board, and we wish to formally welcome them and thank them for choosing to serve the school in this way. The AGM also recognised the substantial contribution of outgoing members in Pinghan Chua, Rachel McClure and Bronwyn Hatherley; our school is richer for their involvement across things like the re-branding, strategic plan execution, and curriculum development. We also recognise Adam Moore's continued input into the building master planning, even as he takes a break on the board for a season due to personal and work commitments. The school's board is currently comprised of eight members, with the following key appointment holders: Chair: Joel Deans, Deputy Chair: John Haley, Treasurer: Josh Thow, Secretary: Susie Edwards. We encourage members of the Emmaus community to become official members of the school, which is a key aspect to the healthy governance of the school. This is the key mechanism for you to have your say of the school, and ensure we remain accountable in accordance with our school's constitution. In conclusion, while there's lots to celebrate, including the recent Federal election as it pertains to religious freedoms in school, much work remains, particularly with respect to our Christian distinctives in a world that seeks to limit the freedoms and choices currently afforded to us.

Our Visual Arts Elective class has been studying a variety of printmaking techniques this semester. As a class we will be attending a workshop under the direct supervision of one of Megalo's experienced printmakers.

Students will be introduced to the world of intaglio printing. Students will explore various etching techniques using their own drawings and sketches. They will have an opportunity to use the fully equipped printmaking studios and experience printing with presses. The students will learn how to etch a plate, ink up, print and dry the prints during the workshop.

As we will be dealing with inks you do not need to wear school uniform but make sure you have covered shoes and suitable clothes for an excursion and possibility of getting dirty with paints.

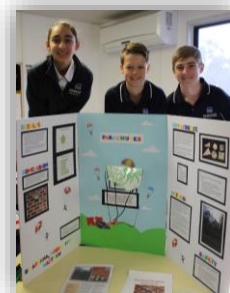
Emmaus Secondary Science Fair: Judges Needed

Sarah was born on Wednesday this week and she is beautiful.

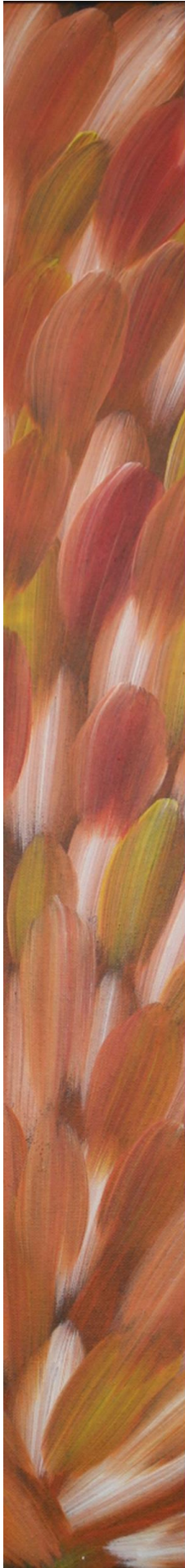

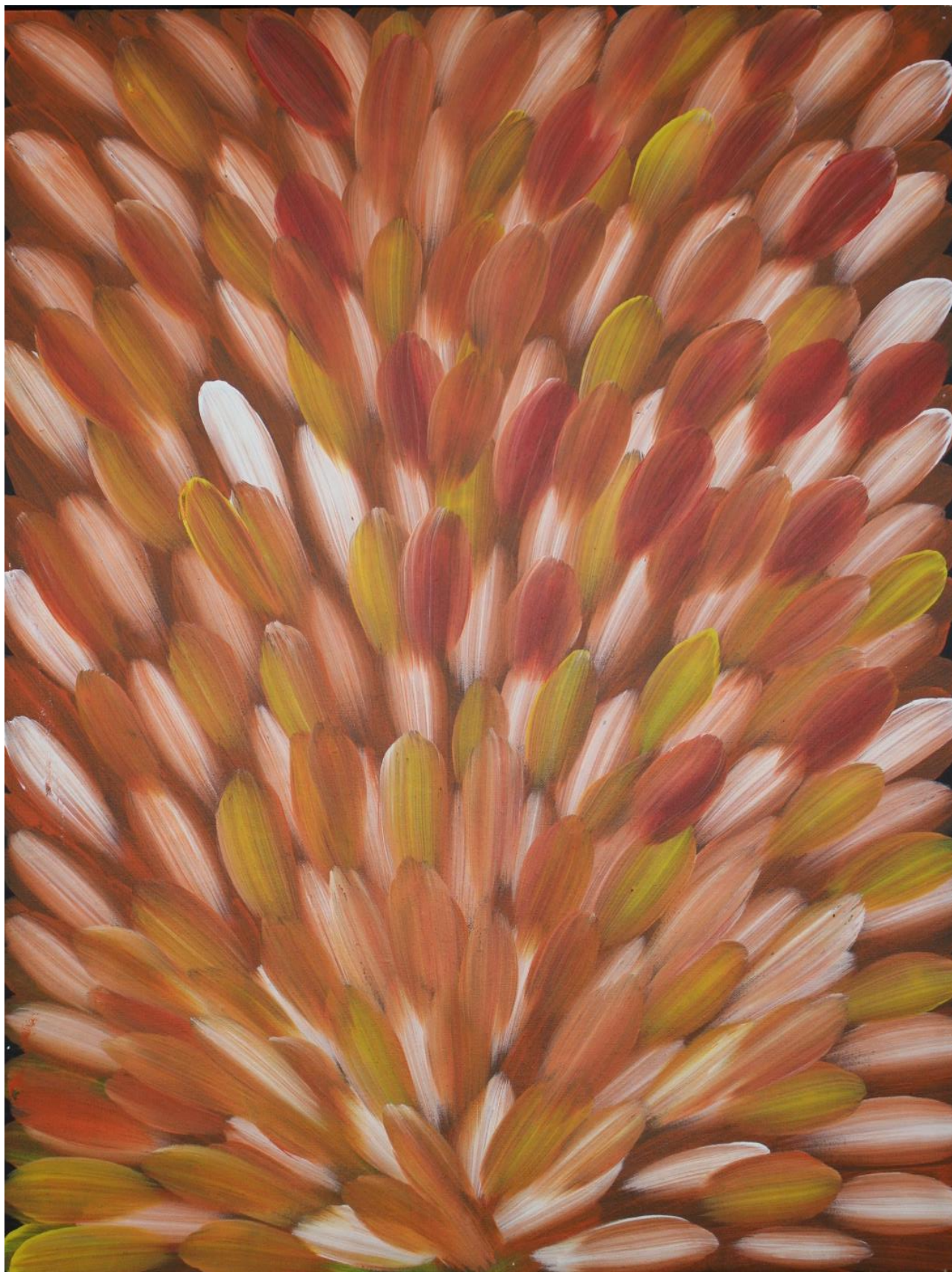
Reconciliation Day Assembly on Friday
