Dear Parents and Guardians of Year 4 and 5 students,

This year, our Year 4 and 5 students will head to Sydney for camp, from Wednesday 7 August to Friday 9 August. The camp will be connected to Humanities and Social Science content about Convict Australia.



During camp we hope to learn lots about Sydney Cove and what it looked like before, during and after the first fleet arrival. We will hear about the beginnings of the first British colony in Australia and examine life in the colony from a range of different perspectives, including the hardships of life as a convict. Camp is also a wonderful opportunity to foster new friendships, strengthen old ones and spend some quality time with God. Students will be expected to complete a camp booklet.

Travel will be provided by bus. The bus will be leaving Emmaus promptly at 9:00am; please ensure you are there by 8:30am to load your luggage and be ready for the trip. The bus is fitted with seat belts for safety and students will be required to wear a seatbelt during the travel time. We will have a rest stop on route to Sydney where students will be having their packed morning tea. Packed lunch will be eaten later that day in Sydney. 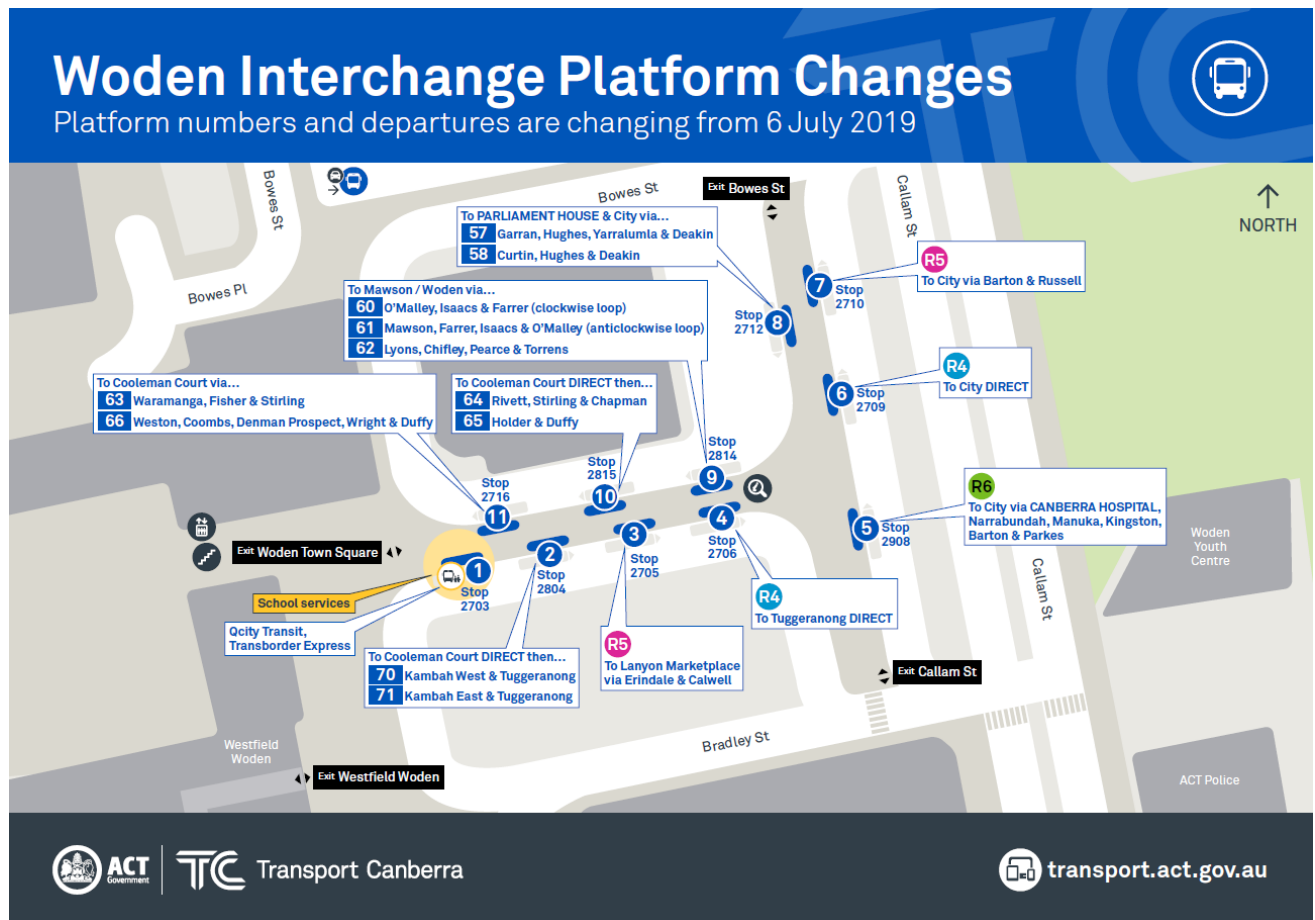

Mr Morris has done an incredible job!

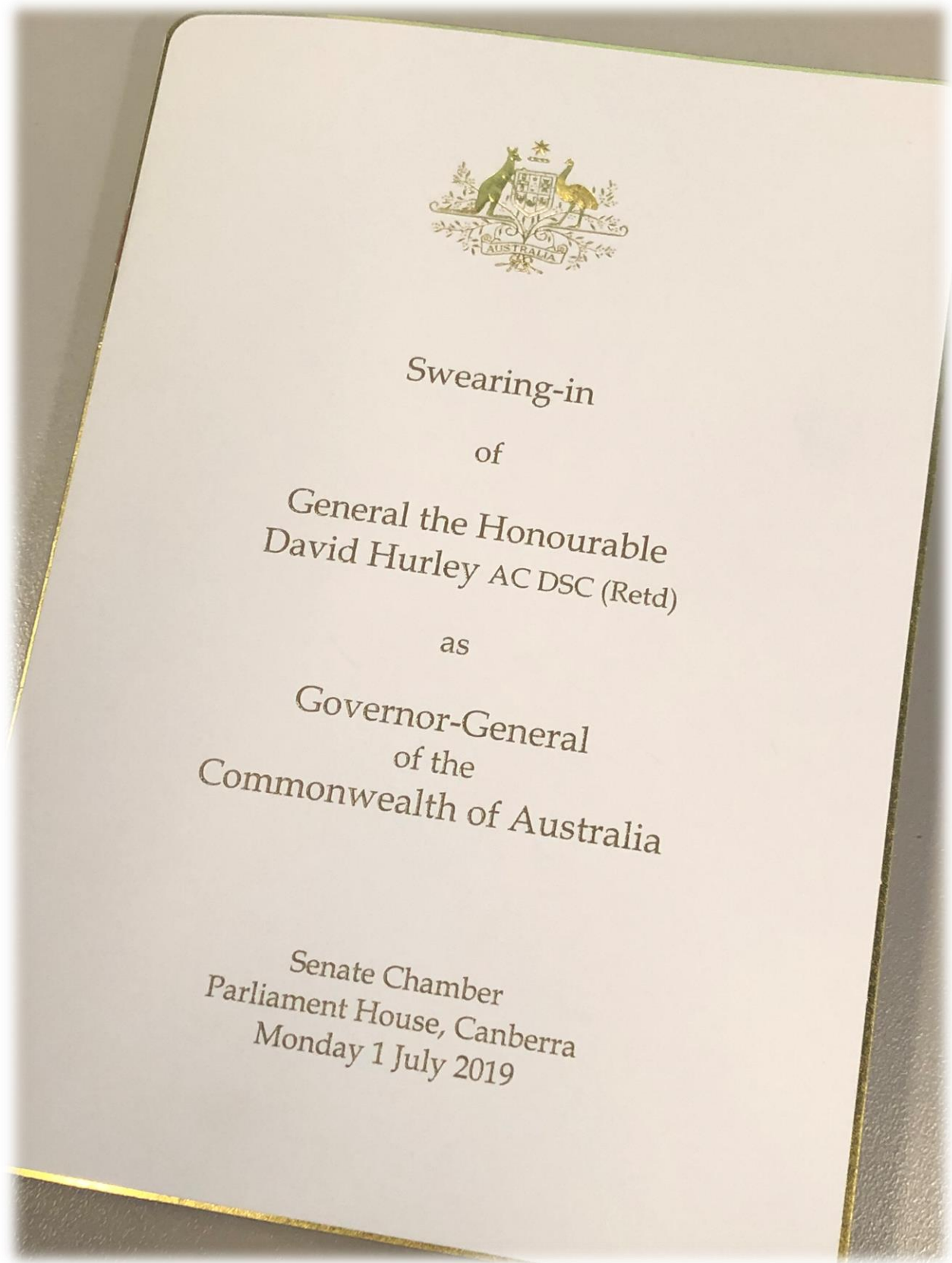
Congratulations Charity H

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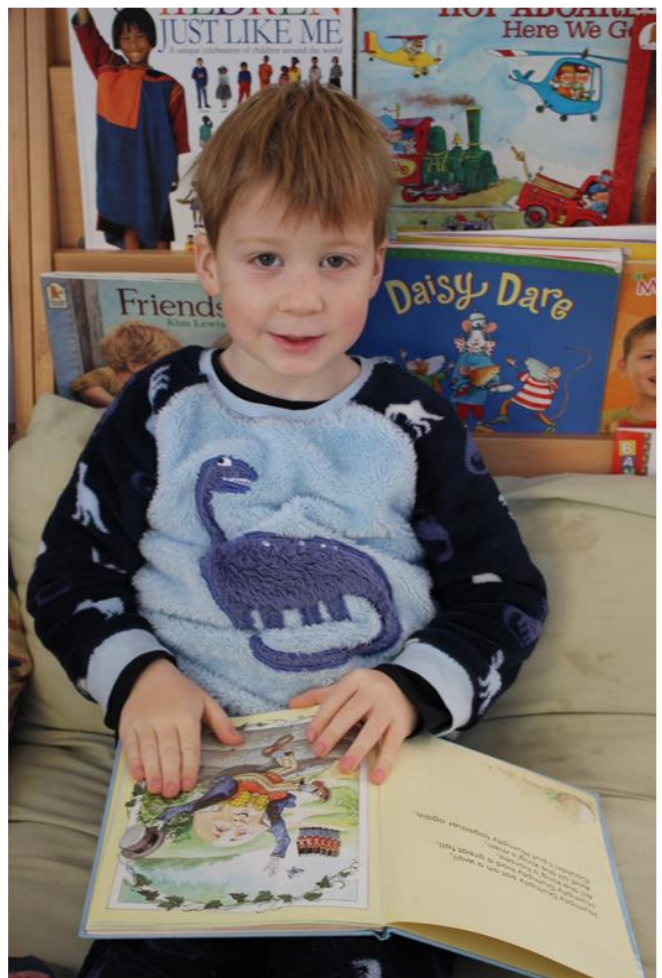

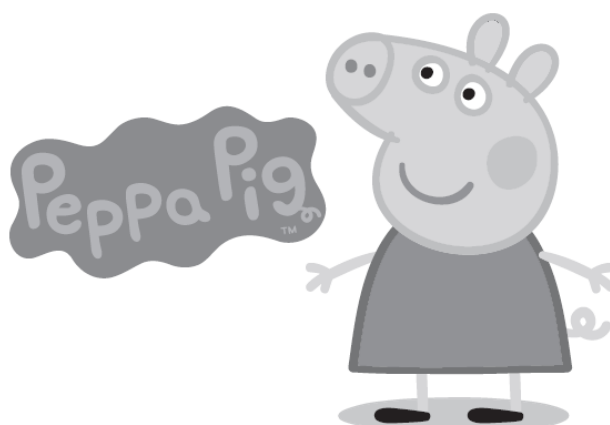
