Year 6 - National Museum of Australia Excursion

Monday, 25th November 2019 (Term 4 Week 7)

Road Ready Information for Students & Parents 2019 (Yr 9-10)

Monday, 9th December to Thursday, 12th December 2019 (Term 4 Week 9)

Year 10 room, starting from 9am to 3pm.

What is Road Ready?

It is a community and school based educational project that will help prepare young ACT people to become safer and more responsible drivers.



The key approach we take with Road Ready school program is to '...do things with the young people' instead of '...doing things to them' in relation to road safety. Through a range of pedagogical approaches and being mindful of different learning styles, Road Ready intends for young people to understand and explain driving behaviours and motivations and to comply voluntarily with road rules and using the roads safely.

A 13 Module course which needs to be completed before a person is issued their Learner's driving licence and includes the road rules will be offered. It focuses on attitudes and information relating to driving. A school-based program offers opportunities for young people to acquire skills and knowledge from informed and supportive teachers/adults and to listen to and reflect upon the ideas, opinions and behaviours of their peers.

We use a classroom program that includes mini research activities, statistical analysis, problem solving, decision-making sessions, group activities, etc to help make young people be aware of issues relating to safer road use.

Why was Road Ready course developed?

First year drivers are three times more likely to have an accident than other drivers and it takes somewhere between 3-5 years of experience to become a competent driver. By introduction of a longer learning period and additional training courses, there has been dramatic reduction in injury and fatality in countries such as Sweden over the last ten years i.e. between 15-40% fewer mortalities in the 17-20 group.

Young drivers everywhere have a higher crash rate because:

- They are inexperienced at driving
- Their cognitive and perceptual skills are not fully developed (basic driving skills are not 'automated'; driver work overload in early driving leads to poor decisions)
- They drive under more dangerous conditions (more discretionary driving; more night driving; inexperienced drinking and driving)
- Their powerful youth motivations lead to more risks (higher speeds; follow too closely; red light running; aggressive driving).
- They soon learn bad habits from older drivers (adopt 'normal' behaviour quickly).

Road Ready course has three main objectives:

1. To encourage early learning of risks and hazards recognition in the driving environment.
2. To encourage the accumulation of as much driving experiences as possible under the safest possible conditions
3. To raise awareness of the complexities of driving.

What is the Learner's responsibility?

Attend a minimum of 12 modules out of the 13 modules, learn the road rules at home and pass the test by the end of the course and also contribute to discussions and all activities during the course time.

What doesn't Road Ready do?

It does not give driving instruction and does not teach road rules.

What can Parents do?

Use the facilities available now to be more informed.

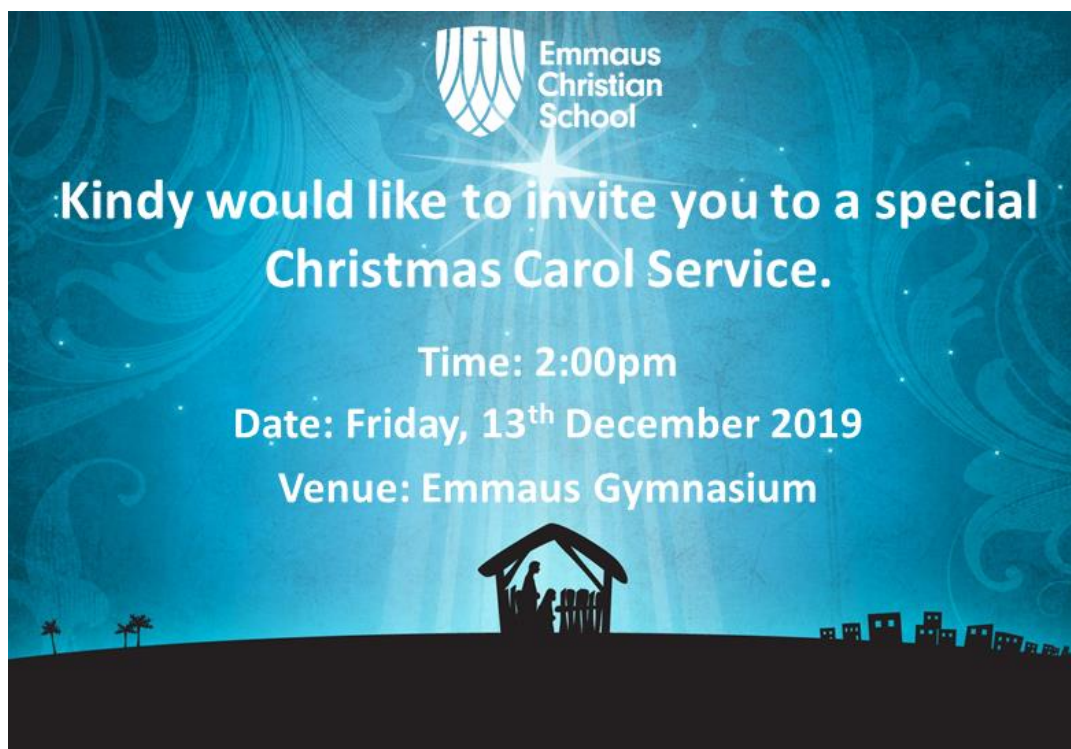

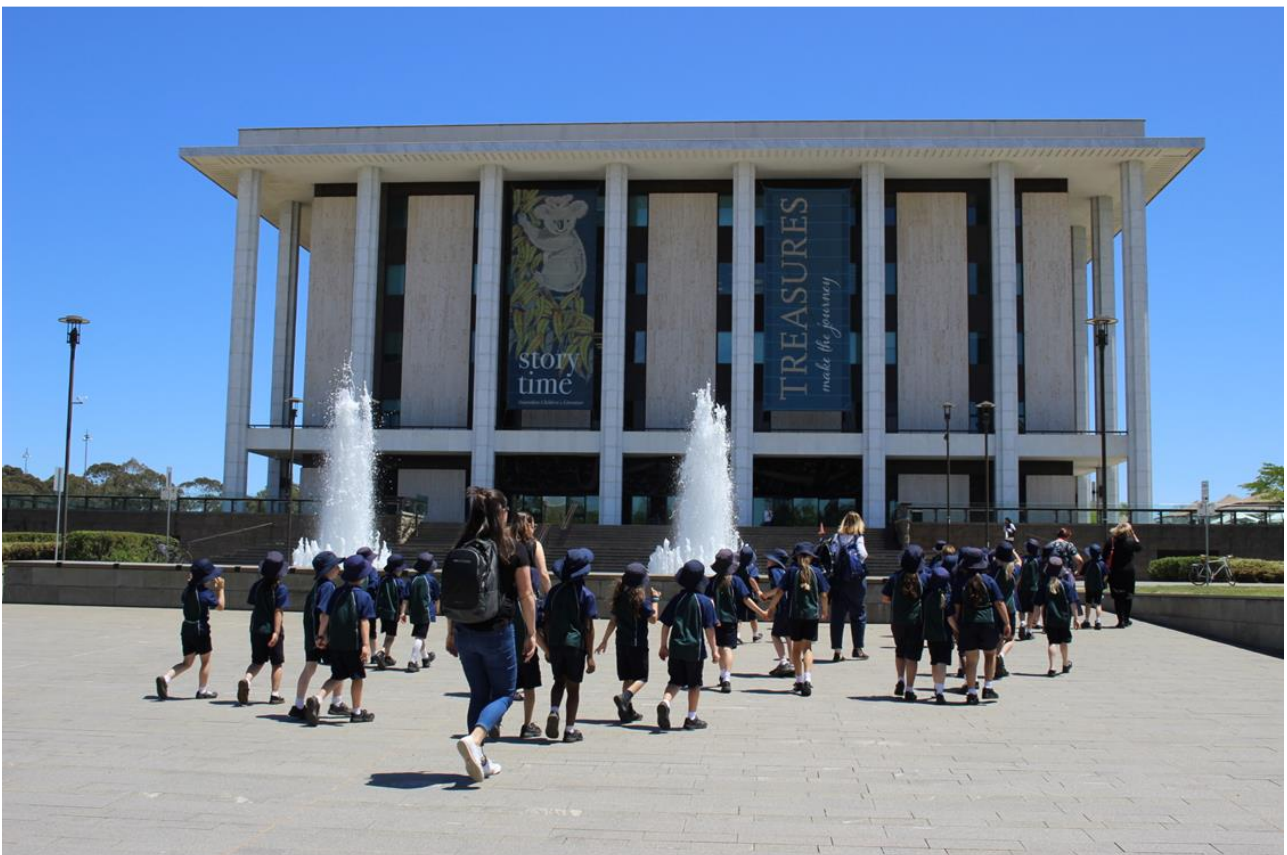
